Steps to Christian Living

Happy New Year/You 2012!

Since many people make New Year Resolutions and set annual goals this time of year I wanted to write about a **block** many people experience in making meaningful and lasting changes in their lives. We have discussed this issue in our **Steps to Christian Living** Sunday School Class and found it very helpful.

The issue is **resistance**. Perhaps you have heard the phrase, "**What you resist persists.**" So what does that really mean? Imagine if Mary had resisted the offer from God through the angel Gabriel. She certainly would have had lots of support for saying no. Suppose Jesus had resisted God's plan for his death and resurrection. We could all understand that. Of course, we may not have those kinds of choices during our lifetime but we have lots of opportunities to **say yes to a higher calling**, or to resist.

I knew one person who was so resistant to his wife's suggestions and finally admitted it was due to a fear that "she" would **change him**. In reality, upon further examination, he realized that he was not only resisting her prayers, observations and requests, he was resisting his own and God's. He was wondering why his life wasn't getting any better. Once he got that his resistance meant all he was and did would persist, he committed to **releasing the resistance** and making the changes he felt in his heart and spirit were the best. He is experiencing much greater happiness and a much improved relationship with self and others as a result of **becoming willing**.



A great way to understand the power of resistance is to place your palms against someone else's and to push against each other. If they are of equal size and strength, no movement will occur and both will soon tire. That is true in most areas of resistance. It keeps you **stuck and exhausted**. Now imagine if you just drop your hands and step

out of the way. The opposition will either fall or have to stabilize their stance and you are free to **move on**.

Now look into your own life and see if there is resistance to something that you would benefit from releasing. Is **God calling** you to make changes in your life that you are resisting with lots of good excuses? Is that resistance blocking you from the life God has planned? Are you ready to step away from the resistance and move on? For support around this or any other spiritual/life issue, join us Sunday mornings at 9:30 upstairs in the Parish House. **We have a chair and a prayer for you.**

Dear Father Joel,

If you turn on the radio today, you will probably hear a song encouraging you to share joy. At The Caring Place, we strive to spread smiles of joy all year long. We see joy on clients' faces when they find a pair of shoes for their child or receive food to fill their empty cupboards. We also see joyful smiles from intangible gifts like a volunteer's listening ear or gentle words of compassion. Sharing joy is a vital part of the ministry at The Caring Place.

Since January of this year, The Caring Place has distributed 323,400 pounds of food to 3,216 families. Along with food, 87% of families also received clothing. In our new diaperLove program we have distributed 156,690 diapers to 462 children. This year our social worker has served more than 500 families with needs above and beyond food, clothing or diapers.

Your congregation's recent gift of 17 space heaters and 102 blankets collected during the November Warmth Drive helped The Caring Place show compassion for our impoverished neighbors. May God richly bless you for supporting this ministry and sharing joy.

St. Luke's Parish Family Notes

Sympathy to Phyllis Martin, Will Martin and family in the recent death of Sara Coffee.

Bob and Martha Pascoe have recently transferred their membership to St. Luke's from Trinity Episcopal Church, Fishkill, NY.

"[A]nd a partridge in a pear tree!" We all know the words of this familiar song which proclaims the twelve days of Christmas, but there is some misunderstanding in our culture about when these twelve days are and why they exist. As I was writing this article on December 21, I heard a retail advertisement on the radio reminding shoppers that their twelve days for Christmas savings were just about gone.

Hopefully, most Episcopalians are aware that the twelve days of Christmas are not a countdown ending on Christmas Day. Instead, they constitute the twelve day season of Christmastide, which begins on Christmas Day, December 25th, and extends through January 5th, the day before the Feast of Epiphany. It is common practice in the church for Christmas decorations to remain in place and for Christmas carols and hymns to continue to be sung throughout this period.

No one really knows the precise date when Jesus was born. Luke's statement that the angelic announcement of Mary's pregnancy came "in the sixth month" is generally understood to have been a reference to the sixth month of her cousin Elizabeth's pregnancy rather than the sixth month of the Roman calendar.

Nevertheless, by the late third cen-

ture, many Christians were celebrating Christ's nativity, but not necessarily on the same date. The two most common dates were December 25th, the prevalent date in the western part of the Roman empire, and January 6th, the prevalent date in the eastern empire and especially in the Holy Land.

It was probably the Roman army which finally turned the tide in favor of December 25th during the fourth century. Romans were already accustomed to celebrating this date as a secular holiday marking the beginning of winter and as a pagan religious festival. As a majority of the Roman soldiers became Christian, they kept their winter day of celebration, but refined it as a celebration of the birth of Jesus.

However, January 6th did not just vanish from the church calendar. Known as the Epiphany in the West and as the Theophany in the East, it has become a feast which celebrates the revealing or manifestation of Christ. During this Epiphany feast and the season of the same name which follows, the church recalls such events from scripture as the arrival of the Wise Men from the East, Jesus' baptism in the Jordan, and the miracle during the wedding feast at Cana.

So the twelve day season of Christmastide covers the December

25th Feast of the Nativity and continues until Epiphany Eve, known as Twelfth Night. This period includes the January 1st Feast of the Holy Name, which this year falls on a Sunday and will be observed at the Eucharist on that day. This is the same feast which in the 1928 prayer book was known as the Feast of the Circumcision, that being the occasion in his life when Jesus, like other Jewish male children, would have formally received his name.

New Adult Sunday School

Class to Begin

When Sunday school resumes for the second semester on January 8th at 9:30 AM, the adult Anglican Studies Class will take up a lectionary based study of the gospel. This will be a discussion class guided by Deacon Art Bass and will be known as "Inside the Gospel". Each week the class will examine the gospel passage appointed for the day, analyzing it line by line and looking at it in the context of history, culture, and its relationship to other passages of scripture. This class, which will meet in the Gathering Room on the first floor of the Parish House, is open to everyone, and Bibles will be provided, although you are welcome to bring your own.

Home Gathering Groups

Home Gatherings are groups of three or four households who get together every month or so for food and fellowship. Each household in the group hosts a dinner, not necessarily in their home, between St. Luke's Annual Meeting and Kickoff Sunday in September 2012. The hosts plan the meal and assign dishes for others to bring. The hosts are also asked to offer a short devotional. Groups are small so everyone can get to know each other.

At the Annual Meeting on January 22nd, 2012, it will be time to announce new Home Gathering Groups for the Spring and Summer. These groups will stay together until September. If you would like to participate, but are unable to host in your home, please simply indicate that below. All who wish to be a part of a group should complete the form below and place it in the offering plate or take it to the church office by Wednesday, January 18.
