

The 2024 St. Luke's Lenten Series is "The Way of the Cross, Part II: Pastoral Reflections on Lent and Holy Week". Fr. Joel Huffstetler is offering a six-week series, exploring important themes of our Christian faith as expressed in our observances of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

This series is a continuation of last year's series, which is available to watch on our St. Luke's YouTube page and on the St. Luke's Podcast, "Faithful Echoes: Readings and Sermons from St. Luke's".

The series runs will continue on Tuesdays through March 26th, from 6:00 PM-7:15 PM in the Parish Hall. Light refreshments and Nursery are provided. 

Casey Cole Higginbotham will be leading us in conversation and reflection on Psalm 18, which begins in verses 1-2 with, "I love you, O LORD my strength, O LORD my stronghold, my crag, and my haven. My God, my rock in whom I put my trust, my shield, the horn of my salvation, and my refuge; you are worthy of praise."

Casey has a longstanding and fruitful

The Planning Team has already been hard at work putting together this amazing weekend. We'll gather for times of prayer, food, and fellowship; opportunities for discussion in small groups; crafting, journaling, hikes, sabbath time, and more. The weekend includes meals with the Convent of St. Mary's in the refectory.

There are two ways to participate in this weekend retreat: Friday-Sunday, and Saturday only. 



The C.L. (Buddy) and Jane Patten Scholarship

Each year St. Luke's Episcopal Church offers its graduating high school seniors the opportunity to apply for and receive the C.L. (Buddy) and Jane Patten Scholarship, as part of our commitment

to the ongoing growth and success of the young people of this church. The scholarship is a one time award of up to \$1,200, and has been funded in year's past by donations and memorials made to the church in memory of many faithful members of the parish.

In the seventeen years since the scholarship was founded, forty-six graduating seniors have received \$45,450 in financial assistance for their college education. Over the next five years, St. Luke's expects to award *at least* another \$15,000 in scholarships. Memorials and donations to support the Patten Scholarship are always appreciated, and help to ensure the scholarship will be available for years to come.

Lunch will be provided for those attending VBS.



Last year St. Luke's and the EYC participated in the Isaiah House 117 Lemonade Stand Challenge, a community-wide fundraiser to support the ministry of our local chapter of Isaiah House. The sixteen participating churches raised \$13,552; of that, St. Luke's raised \$3,992!

Isaiah 117 House helps kids as they enter foster care by providing a safe and kid/teen friendly home. Inside the home, we are staffed with well trained and passionate volunteers and staff that spend time with each child to make their day less hard, and more fun/peaceful/restful. While in the home, we also provide each child with a duffle bag filled with all new items that are hand picked for that child-- products, clothes, toys, and a Bible that will help their transition into foster care.

The Lemonade Stand Challenge is a community-wide fundraising initiative for families, church groups, and businesses to raise money to support children entering foster care:

- \$50 provides new clothes and shoes for a child
- \$300 fully sponsors one child's transition into foster care
- \$500 covers 2 weeks of groceries at Isaiah House

This year's Lemonade stand Challenge is Sunday, May 5th, which also happens to be Youth Sunday. The EYC will have a Lemonade Stand set up in the courtyard between services and during Coffee Hour to raise money (and sell lemonade!) for the local chapter of Isaiah House (Bradley-Polk County TN).
