Historic Brick Repointing Project Final Report

After years of planning, preparation, and prayer, our church embarked on a historic rehabilitation project to restore the original tuckpointing. This effort was partially funded by a historic preservation grant, secured through the tireless efforts of previous Vestry members.

Following the receipt of bids from qualified contractors, the Vestry voted to proceed with the full scope of the tuckpointing restoration project in early 2024.

Members of the Capital Projects Committee shepherded the project throughout 2024 and into 2025, working diligently to ensure the work remained within budget and adhered to historic restoration standards. The project was closely reviewed by both the Capital Projects Committee and the Junior Warden to verify that all work was successfully completed.

A final punch list was compiled by parish representatives and provided to the contractor. Once those outstanding items were addressed, the contractor's work was accepted in early May 2025. All brick masonry joints were carefully removed and repointed using historically appropriate mortar, as outlined in the project scope. The contractor has provided the church with a five-year warranty to cover unforeseen or latent deficiencies in the work. The repointing completed during this project is expected to stand the test of time for at least a generation.

We deeply appreciate the parish's patience and resilience throughout this construction effort. We are also grateful to the church staff for their encouragement and timely support as the project progressed.

Drawing Together from the Well of Learning



Nancy Thomas shares a reflection on her mission trip to Mauritania in Africa back in January 2025 to support a fledgling nursing program.

Earlier this year, I made my second trip to the African country of Mauritania. Mauritania is a North African country and borders the Atlantic Ocean on the west and stretches into the Sahara Desert to the North. It is home to over 4 million

people. Over 90% of the country is the Sahara Desert. In the northern part of the country, a town named Chinguetti (red circle on the map) has become dear to my heart. The little town of Chinguetti used to be much larger and on a trade and travel route to Mecca. It is home to an ancient library of Islamic Scholarship that is renowned throughout the world. The Sahara Desert is expanding and has already covered some of the older portions of the city.

The Sahara Desert sand is beautiful. The wind is strong. The sky is a beautiful blue. The women and men are mostly covered with traditional robes and cloth that protect them against the wind and sun. There are lots of animals that wander in the streets and yards: goats, camels, cats, dogs,



sheep, and donkeys. The roads are not paved but people do have cars. It was an easy walk from the house where we stayed to the hospital.

After retiring as a nurse educator, I wanted to be able to use my calling as a nurse in some way. I was open to traveling abroad if the opportunity presented itself. A friend visited the little desert town of Chinguetti and heard about a fledgling nursing school that needed some assistance.

I visited Chinguetti first in December 2023. After the first trip I began corresponding with the director and founder, Dr. Amanda Beattie and began working with the nursing program remotely. I worked on the curriculum, lectures, and implementing a learning management system. Many fellow nursing colleagues assisted me with this project. A shout out to two friends here at St. Luke. Jean Reschenthaler developed a lecture for the nursing leadership course and Michael Myers helped me numerous times advising me regarding transcript and diploma preparations.

The purpose for the January 2025 trip was to prepare the final exams for the students, a graduation ceremony, and to assist in preparing a proposal to submit to Mauritania's minister of health to both record the education the current students received and to be granted official status and approval for continuing the nursing training program. We also hoped that the minister of health would grant the students approval to practice as nurses based on the education they had received. As we entered the second week of my trip, the students requested, and we granted an extra day to study for their last final exam. Thankfully they all passed with high scores! Then we began in earnest preparing for the graduation ceremony. Everyone in the community pitched in. Embroidered caps and gowns arrived from the capital; a delicious meal was prepared by the hospital staff; relatives of the graduates were transported from remote locations; the classroom received festive decorations; and diplomas were printed and signed.

The three graduates gave their speeches in English and Arabic. Officials and family members also gave speeches on their behalf. It was a great celebration. As part of their culture, the students would put either their cap or gown on a family or friend and that indicated the student honored that person and recognized their role in helping them through the rigorous program. One of the graduates who had less than a middle school education when he entered the nursing program gave a moving speech saying that this was the happiest day of his life!



Lots of pictures and videos were made and some were posted on social media. The government officials saw social media posts and were pleased with such positive event coverage. We heard exciting news the morning we left to return home that the minister of health was granting his approval that the graduates could practice as nurses. My heart overflowed with joy and gratefulness!

Plans are underway for continued curriculum and course preparation for the next cohort of nursing students. Although the minister of health granted verbal approval for the program and for the graduates to practice as nurses, we are still awaiting the official written approval. Our next trip is planned for the first of December. Part of the upcoming trip may be visiting Oaudane (smaller red circle on the map) which is approximately two hours north of Chinguetti. Oaudane will host an ancient cities festival. The city's name Oaudane, means two wells, a well of learning and a well of dates. We believe this will be the perfect opportunity to launch the nursing program for the second cohort of students and for the government to grant the official stamp of approval of the program and its graduates. Does this project interest you? Would you like to help with the project remotely or in person? Would you like to see the beautiful Sahara Desert firsthand? Would you like to encourage and build up the people there?



During a traditional Mauritanian Tea, I asked the young Mom who was serving us what she would like me to tell my friends in Cleveland, Tennessee, about Chinguetti. She said, "It is a safe and peaceful place. There are no robbers or bandits there!" It is peaceful there. The people are friendly and welcoming. They want people to visit their lovely Chinguetti. They roll out the red carpet

Mauritanian style for their guests.

If you are interested in participating in this project and/or traveling to Mauritania. Please let me know.

Each summer, St. Luke's and the EYC participate in the Isaiah House 117 Lemonade Stand Challenge, a community-wide fundraiser to support the ministry of our local chapter of Isaiah House. Over the past two summers, Isaiah 117 House has

raised over \$20,000 during this annual event, for which St. Luke's and the EYC have raised over \$5,000.

Isaiah 117 House helps kids as they enter foster care by providing a safe and kid/teen friendly home. Inside the home, they are staffed with well trained and passionate volunteers and staff that spend time with each child to make their day less hard, and more fun/peaceful/restful. While in the home, they also provide each child with a duffle bag filled with all new items that are hand picked for that child-- products, clothes, toys, and a Bible that will help their transition into foster care.

The Lemonade Stand Challenge is a community-wide fundraising initiative for families, church groups, and businesses to raise money to support children entering foster care: \$50 provides new clothes and shoes for a child; \$300 fully sponsors one child's transition into foster care; \$500 covers 2 weeks of groceries at Isaiah House.

This year's Lemonade stand Challenge is Sunday, July 20th. The EYC will have a Lemonade Stand set up in the courtyard between services and during Coffee Hour to raise money (and sell lemonade!) for the local chapter of Isaiah House (Bradley-Polk County TN). For a number of years, one of the mid-week Formation offerings here at St. Luke's has been the small-group formation program known as Education for Ministry, more commonly called EfM. EfM brings together a group of 6-12 participants who meet weekly throughout the school year for study, conversation, and reflection. Designed as a four-year certificate program by the School of Theology at the University of the South, Sewanee, participants make a one year commitment at a time to the EfM Group as they explore scripture, church history, theology, and ethics.

As part of the program, the group discerns together how we each can minister in the world. One example is our outreach ministry to the Cleveland Emergency Shelter, Loaves and Fishes, which emerged from one EfM group. Other ministries can often be intimate and personal, such as the long-term care of a loved one, or a renewed sense of vocation in one's professional life.

Last fall, the EfM Group re-formed after a hiatus and had an enriching year of formation, prayer, and fellowship. That inaugural group has now completed Year 1, and is looking to invite new members into the group who are interested in intentional study and conversation.

There are several ways to participate:

- New: Join as a new Year 1 member of the cohort!
- **Returning:** Pick up where you left off (Years 2,3,4)!
- Graduate: Audit your favorite year!

In September, we are starting a new EfM Year for those interested in beginning or resuming their EfM journey. The group will meet on Thursdays from 6:00-8:00 PM, with childcare provided. The cost is \$350/ person for the year, with scholarship funds available.



Each week an average of 600 bags of food are packed and delivered by dedicated volunteers to go home with the children every Friday afternoon during the school year. The bags contain 6 small meals that are kidfriendly and easy to prepare. This gives the child something to eat, prevents others in the home from having to skip meals, and lifts the weight of worry from having lack of access to one of our most basic needs.

With your support, we donate almost \$5,000 a year to feed at risk children in our community. The month of August is our primary fundraising time for this ministry, but you can support the Sac Pac program year round. 
