


Christmas Eve, December 24th | Christmas Pageant Service at 5:00 PM*


Sunday, January 11th Epiphany Feast of Lights Service at 10:45 AM*

Our 8:00 AM and 9:30 AM Services of Holy Eucharist and Church School Classes will happen as usual.






St. Luke's Episcopal Church is part of the Episcopal Diocese of East Tennessee which maintains Safe Church, Safe Communities policies in accordance with national church guidelines. Under those guidelines all church members in positions of leadership, supervision of children and youth, or with key holder access must renew their SCSC Training every three years. These policies were updated in 2023 and we are due for a round of recertifications.

From the diocesan website: "The Episcopal Diocese of East Tennessee is committed to protecting each child of God. Sexual misconduct on the part of any clergy person, employee or volunteer of any congregation, school, or diocesan affiliated organization violates the mission of the Church, is prohibited and will not be tolerated. The Safe Church, Safe Communities courses teach how exploitation and harassment occur, the awareness we need to prevent such occurrences, and how to respond, should an incident of exploitation or harassment occur."

Those persons needing to complete the Safe Church, Safe Communities Training or Recertification will be contacted by Isaac Doty, St. Luke's Safe Church Coordinator, in January 2026. Please follow the instructions provided and complete the necessary modules by March 31st.

This process is by and large a formality to keep St. Luke's in compliance with the updated national and diocesan policies for Safe Church, Safe Communities. We're grateful for each of you and your ministry within the congregation of St. Luke's.

Or put another way: Going forward, are we being called to travel by a different way?




